How did you come to Panama City Beach?

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
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A Few Minutes With

CREATING YOUR OWN DIGITAL VIDEO

The Web clip culture inspired by YouTube and Google Video has paved the way for businesses to create their own high-quality content. These outlets have changed how people access information. Used correctly it can build the loyalty of current customers and educate potential clients about the benefits of their products and services. Try thinking of it as your company's own TV network which is broadcast in offices and homes worldwide. Additionally, it's a broadcast medium which is less cost prohibitive than advertising via traditional broadcast outlets.

Digital video can be created from existing marketing materials. For example, video from commercials and product demonstrations can be redeployed for Web distribution. Even better, without the constraints of traditional broadcast requirements, companies have the opportunity to provide viewers with a greater level of detail and interactivity. However, some of the strategies of traditional video production still apply:

- **1.** Keep it short. Segments should be between 30 seconds and 3 minutes. Why? Because laptop computers and mobile phones are a natural way for consumers to pass the time of day while they waiting for their latte at Starbucks or sit in the lobby of their dentist's office.
- **2.** Keep it real. Real life examples bring authenticity and humanity to your message or product. If people can relate, they will react. Storytelling holds the interest of your audience.
- **3.** Keep it visual. Only use talking heads in segments where there aren't images available to illustrate products or services.
- **4.** Keep it clear. Don't let poor audio distract from your message.



And if you're concerned that online video won't reach the demographic you are looking to attract to your business, consider the Pew Research report titled "Online Videos go Mainstream" from July 2007 which found that 57% of US adults watch Internet video.

Four Day Work Week

This summer Cornerstone Marketing & Advertising, based in Grayton Beach, FL, has been experimenting with a four-day work week in the interest of reducing its carbon footprint, spending less on fuel and offering refreshing three-day weekends for its staff. The new schedule has proved to be beneficial and will be in place until further notice.

The standard work week in America has remained relatively constant since the Fair Labor Standards Act was passed in 1938, standardizing the eight-hour work day and the 40-hour work week. The idea of switching to a four-day work week for conservation purposes dates back to the 1970s oil crisis, but with today's skyrocketing gas prices, many companies and institutions are implementing it.

According to The Oil Drum, an evidencebased discussion forum on energy, there are approximately 133 million workers in America, 80% of whom commute to work alone by car, covering an average commute of 16 miles each way. Their statistics show that shifting to a four-day work week nationally would reduce the commuterrelated gasoline consumption normally used for the fifth day of work by 162,133,333 gallons which translates to 8,314,530 barrels of oil. This statistic assumes that workers spend their free time at home not driving to and from leisure activities; however, the required energy used to get to work is sharply reduced.

All over the country, businesses and government offices are considering the shift, citing reasons like reduced energy consumption and costs, taking better care of the environment and improving quality of life for employees who are able to enjoy a better work-life balance. Those who have experimented with this concept find that the same amount of work can be done in a 10-hour per day, four-day work week as is accomplished in the more traditional 8-hour per day, five-day week.

The Rescue Mission receives no monies from the Government and relies upon private donations, four thrift shops and now the profits from the garbage. Community Update

Mayor Gayle Oberst, City of PCB



A City budget workshop was conducted in July and the final approval of the 2008-2009 budget takes place in August. The City, with a full time population of 14,000 to 15,000 residents, has a budget of approximately

\$170 million which includes the general fund, utilities fund and Front Beach Road CRA. In the declining economy, the City's 1% occupational license fee and franchise fees continue to be strong.

While other cities are suffering cut backs due to the property tax caps and cuts, Panama City Beach's revenues are holding their own...the City has no property tax therefore the cuts do not affect the general and utilities funds.

The construction of Dan Russell Pier (city pier) at Pier Park is progressing and the anticipated completion date is July 2009. The Pier is being built primarily with FEMA mitigation funds and when completed will be more substantial during hurricanes. It will be one foot wider and will extend over 1,200 feet into the Gulf.

The ordinance requiring posting of flag warning system and rip tide definitions has been altered to include not only public beach accesses but also those accesses on private property (resorts). The City is gearing up to have lifeguards at the City Pier and the County has agreed to provide lifeguards at the County Pier (MB Miller). The lifeguards and equipment should be in place for the spring season.

Fire Chief John Daly is working with Federal and State agencies to develop a Comprehensive Fire Working Plan and to designate the City as a fire wise community. With this plan and designation the City will quality for various grants and support, and it will make our community safer.

Nursing at FSU PC

Florida State University-Panama City offers a Bachelor of Science degree program in nursing for students already holding a Registered Nurse (RN) license. Programs of this type are commonly re-

ferred to as "RN to BSN" programs. Most of the students entering the program have completed an associate's degree in nursing at a community college. Almost all of the students work full time as RNs while pursuing their studies as part-time students.

This junior and senior year degree program includes courses such as: Advanced Health Assessment, Multicultural Factors & Health, Nursing Concepts, Nursing the Aging Family, Public Health Nursing, Research Process for Professional Practice, and Professional Nursing Leadership and Management.

Several of the graduates have gone on for graduate study, either at FSU or other higher education institutions. Graduate programs for Advanced Nurse Practitioners or Nurse Anesthetists seem to be popular options.

Many of the other graduates have moved into leadership positions as directors of nursing units within local health care organizations. Still others have gone into education, either teaching nursing at GCCC or other institutions or coordinating an organization's internal education activities.

In times past, nurses were grossly underpaid for the contributions they made. That has changed. Nurses now make some of the highest salaries for new college graduates, right up there with engineering graduates. Market conditions have corrected the inequities of the past.

Nearly every state in the country seems to be suffering a shortage of nurses. FSU-Panama City is doing its part to address this issue.


After weeks of preparation, the governmental affairs committees from the Bay County Chamber and The Greater Panama City Beaches Chamber co-hosted two candidate forums.

On August 19, candidates for Bay District Schools School Board and Superintendent participated in the event. The candidates were asked to state their views on topics such as the current uniform policy, closed campuses and the never ending appointed versus elected superintendent.

Two days after the school debate, we had the opportunity to host a forum for the candidates for Bay County Commissioner Districts 1, 3 and 5. The incumbents and their challengers discussed their views on the incinerator, increased bed tax, capitol improvement priorities and much more.

Gulf Coast Workforce Board

Kimberly Bodine, Executive Director Gulf Coast Workforce Board



In tough economic times, the workforce system provides programs to assist both employers and individuals alike. One such program is the Extended Unemployment Compensation program which was

signed into law on June 30, 2008. Through the program, extended unemployment compensation of up to 13 weeks will be provided to unemployed workers who have exhausted their regular unemployment benefits.

The extension became effective July 6, 2008, and is scheduled to end March 31, 2009. Individuals currently receiving benefits and who subsequently exhaust their benefits will receive the extension automatically whereas individuals not in current claim status and who may be eligible for the extension will be mailed a notice/application advising them of the availability of extended benefits.

Another program that may be beneficial for employers and individuals is the Short Term Compensation (STC) program. This voluntary employer program is designed to help businesses keep their staff by reducing the weekly hours of their employees, instead of temporarily laying off employees. The program permits prorated unemployment compensation benefits to employees whose work hours and earnings are reduced as part of an STC plan to avoid total layoff of some employees. The program encourages work sharing as an alternative to lavoff and eases the financial burden of unemployment.

Employees retained during a temporary slowdown are able to quickly resume high production levels when business conditions improve. Employers are spared the expense of recruiting, hiring, and training new workers. In turn, the employees are spared the hardships of full unemployment.

Employers who must permanently reduce their workforce may use the program as a transition to layoff. Affected employees may continue to work at reduced levels with an opportunity to find other employment before the expected layoff.

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
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
